A) Briefing about the center Purpose and Focus including Key activities

Purpose and Focus

The Purpose and focus of the Centre is to establish a rural one stop multi-disciplinary Health Care, Learning Resource and Research Centre that will create sustainable strategies for the improvement of livelihoods of the people of Tsengiwe and close by villages (especially those villages falling in Ward 6), especial those who are infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. Training the community on how to manage, protect and commercialize their own assets as means to create employment opportunities for local residents and also to increase community economic growth.

Offering health care programs and services, those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.

- OVC and vulnerable support programs.
- Awareness campaigns/ health care education and prevention programs.
- Training Community Health Care workers on home based nursing care and relevant capacity building programs.
- Provision of information dissemination programs
- Home Based Nursing Care
- Establishing various support groups including those that are HIV/AIDS volunteers, youth, parents and victims of violence.
- Cultural heritage programs.
- Food security (gardening)
- Skills development (Sewing)

B) Home based visits report

2023 April to 2024 March

- Total house hold visited and revisited **102 households** visited and **35 households** re visited **TOTAL = 137**
- TOTAL **Adults +36 Years =157** (Males = 67 and Females = 90) and 19 are Living with disability
- TOTAL **Youth (15-35) Years=37** (Males = 15 and Females=22) and 1 is living with disability.
- **TOTAL OVC's (0-14) Years =73** (Male =38 and Females =35)
- **TOTAL NO OF CLIENTS = 267 (Males = 120 and Female = 147**

CASE REFFERALS

1x Anger Management session was conducted as part of intervention between two families.

2x Families Matter session was conducted as part of intervention between two guardians

1x Mediation session was conducted as part intervention between married couple.

1x Treatment adherence session was conducted as part of intervention between family of a person living with HIV/AIDS.

13x OVC's were assisted to get Child Support Grant.

Training of care givers on SBC Programs as Co-facilitators = 4 (2 =males and 2 =females)

Food security (gardening) = 4 (2males and 2 females)
